EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This document presents the **Monthly Progress Report for July 2026** on the implementation of the **HIV/AIDS Awareness and Prevention Campaign Program** under the **Kigoma Airport Upgrading Project**.

During the reporting period, “**The Green Shadow-Tz**” successfully implemented several activities in accordance with the approved project implementation plan. The report provides a detailed overview of the key activities carried out in **July 2026**, including **HIV/AIDS prevention education to Construction worker at main site** , **community HIV volunteering HIV Testing at Mangurueni, Katubuka Ward**, and **condom distribution** to the targeted beneficiaries and Submission of the **preform invoice** for project payment and .

In addition, the report highlights key achievements, identifies challenges encountered during implementation, and provides recommendations for improving future activities. It also outlines the planned activities for **August 2026** to ensure the continued progress, effectiveness, and sustainability of the HIV/AIDS Awareness and Prevention Campaign Program.

1.1 RATIONALE FOR HIV/AIDS, STI'S TRAINING AND AWARENESS PROGRAMME IN CONSTRUCTIONS PROJECT.

There is limited epidemiological data in the communities of Tanzania on the links between major construction development and HIV/AIDS. What is known, however, is that construction projects invariably involve lots of transient male workers. These workers are away from their families and the social norms applicable in their home communities. Many of them have few things to spend money on other than entertainment in the form of alcohol and sex. The extent of the demand for sex work is such that some sex workers are known to follow different construction companies from one site to another.

Tanzania AIDS Commission (TACAIDS) on its Health Sector HIV and AIDS Strategic Plan IV (2017 – 2022) indicate that men who buy sex from women are “probably the most important determinant of future rates of HIV” in Tanzania. Higher mobility of these men means that should they become infected with HIV they are likely to put others at risks too, especially their spouses. In other words, construction projects can significantly increase the number and frequency of men buying sex, and this is a key factor in determining the extent of HIV spread. Given the number of people associated with major construction projects, the importance of the transport sector in HIV prevention is clear. By reducing unsafe sex among a workforce that predominantly consists of men who tend to have multiple sexual partners, including sex workers, the construction sector can make a strong contribution to reducing the spread of HIV.

1.2 ASSIGNMENT OBJECTIVES

The main objective is to increase the skills and knowledge of construction workers, supervisors, and the local community through STIs and HIV/AIDS awareness, Prevention campaigns, and relevant training.

- Specific Objectives
- Training and sensitizing local communities and Construction workers such as truck drivers, machine operators, labourers, supervisors, and communities on taking and practicing safe behaviours to prevent transmission of STIs, HIV/AIDS
- To strengthen the platforms that allow concrete and coordinated contributions to the improvement of HIV/AIDS prevention awareness among local communities, Engineer's, staff and contractor workers.

1.3 SCOPE OF WORK

The implementation of STIs and HIV/AIDS AWARENESS campaign program is conducted in communities surrounding the Project area and for construction workers as well as HIV/AIDS prevention and awareness campaigns along the construction areas. The following activities will be implemented:

- Conduct KigomaUjiji Municipal council/regional government Authorities, Consultant, Contractor, TANROADS Authority Key Staffs, Stakeholders' induction and informative meetings on ensuring smooth uptake for community actors
- Conduct awareness raising campaigns on HIV and AIDS Transmission and Prevention for construction workers, and Communities neighboring the Project sites in project areas
- Conduct Educational Video Screening to the construction workers, communities and schools in project streets on HIV prevention (Two shows in two quarters)
- Design, Produce and Distribute Information, Education and Communication Materials on Public Health and HIV/AIDS within Project localities
- Conduct one day (on monthly basis) training for Construction workers on How to Protect themselves from contracting HIV and AIDS and observe Health Safety
- Promote, demonstrate the proper and appropriate use of and distribute condoms to Construction Local communities at risk
- Conduct Community Mobilization, Voluntary HIV testing to Construction workers and the local Communities of Kigoma airport project areas
- Participating and attend regular project meetings to share and discuss the HIV / AIDS situation with other Stakeholders in KigomaUjiji Municipal.

1.4 ENGAGEMENT OF THE GREEN SHADOW-TZ

The Green Shadow-Tz was established in 2019 and legally registered in August 2020 as a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) under NGO Act, 2002 with registration number

00NGO/R/1293. The organization's headquarters are based in Kigoma-Ujiji Municipal. The Organization is sub-contracted by CHINA RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING GROUP CO. LTD (CRCEG) and has been contracted by TANROADS to undertake a project of Rehabilitation and upgrading of Kigoma airport The Green Shadow-Tz has been awarded as sub-contracted by China Railway Construction Engineering Group Co. Ltd (CRCEG)to provide service of STIs and HIV/AIDS AWARENESS and PREVENTION campaign program during the implementation of Rehabilitation and upgrading of Kigoma airport project

The organization is currently assigned to conduct STIs and HIV/AIDS Awareness and Prevention campaign program by possessing the necessary technical skills, experience, and personnel and collaborating with other key stakeholders such as Kigoma Regional authority, district councils, and community leaders along the road construction areas.

SUMMARY OF VOLUNTEERING HIV TESTING ACHIEVEMENT JULY2026 AT KATUBUKA WARD, MANGURUENI AREA

During the reporting period, **The Green Shadow Tanzania** successfully conducted a **Voluntary HIV Testing (VHT) campaign** at **Mangurueni Area, Katubuka Ward**, as part of the HIV/AIDS Awareness and Prevention Campaign under the Kigoma Airport Upgrading Project. The exercise provided free, confidential, and voluntary HIV testing and counselling services to community members. The campaign increased awareness of HIV status, promoted early diagnosis, encouraged healthy behaviours, and strengthened community participation in HIV prevention efforts. Overall, the activity contributed to improving access to HIV services and supporting the project's goal of reducing new HIV infections among the target population.

4.0 Planned Activities for August 2026

In August 2026, the organization will continue implementing routine HIV/AIDS awareness and prevention activities targeting construction workers and surrounding communities. These activities aim to increase knowledge, promote positive health-seeking behaviors, and reduce the risk of HIV transmission.

Key planned activities include:

- Conducting HIV/AIDS and STI awareness and education sessions for construction workers, engineering personnel, *mama lishe* (food vendors), and *bodaboda* riders.
- Promoting voluntary HIV testing and counseling (HTC), including both pre-test and post-test counseling.
- Demonstrating the correct and consistent use of condoms and distributing male condoms to construction workers and other targeted groups.
- Encouraging community members to access HIV testing and other available HIV prevention services through nearby health facilities.
